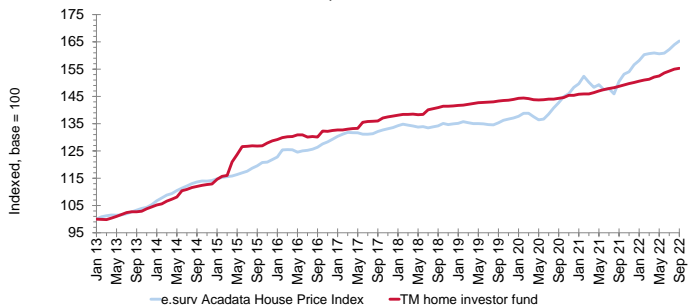
**Investment Objective Summary**

The Fund invests in private rented sector housing across mainland UK regions and aims to capture UK house price growth and provide an element of income return. The property investment manager, Hearthstone Asset Management Limited, uses quantitative asset allocation and qualitative regional stock selection to build a portfolio of assets reflecting the distribution of UK mainland housing stock which are let under assured shorthold tenancies (AST's) and corporate lets. Investment returns comprise capital growth and rental income. The e.surv Acadata House Price Index is used for performance comparisons only. It is not a target benchmark and the fund is not constrained by it. This index has been chosen as a comparator benchmark as it is based upon actual sales completed and is mix-adjusted.

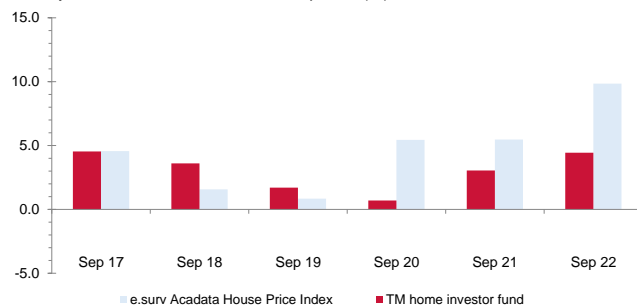

**Property Investment Manager's commentary**

CBRE Limited, the Fund's Standing Independent Valuer, increased its valuations on 9 properties in September by a total of £45,000. These units are all houses located in Southern England. The property portfolio has now seen valuation uplifts for 18 consecutive months totalling 6.75%.

House price indices derived from Land Registry data (such as e.surv Acadata) continue to show a high degree of volatility. The latest report from e.surv Acadata indicates annual house price growth of 9.8% but they explain that RightMove noted the delay in purchasing a property has extended on average to over 100 days. If correct, the "September" market data may in fact be reflecting events that took place in June 2022. However, the housing market has shown considerable resilience over recent months, despite predictions to the contrary. Although interest rates had been edging up - and not least in comparison to average wages - it was clear there was still considerable buying power and appetite in the market. This - in combination with a limited supply of existing homes coming onto the market and the relatively low output of new homes - meant that demand continued to outstrip supply, and prices reflected that.

The Fund benefits from 98% occupancy at the end of September and due to high demand for quality rental property units are re-letting quickly. Average rental growth over 12 months stands at 4.3% (versus ONS Rental Index at 3.4% for August 2022 which is the most recent data available), with re-lets increasing by 7.7% and existing tenants' rent reviews by 2.95%. This rise has mainly been over the last 6-months with rents increasing by 6.2% in this period (9.6% on re-lets and 3.8% on rent reviews). Whilst we strive to provide the best returns for investors, we are extremely wary of the increasing cost-of-living crisis and endeavour to work with all tenants to get the fairest Market Rents for the Fund's properties.

\* The Standing Independent Valuer (SIV) attached a material valuation uncertainty clause to the Spectrum flats in Manchester in April 2021 following a failed EWS1 (external wall safety) assessment. These assessments were introduced by the government to improve fire safety of high-rise buildings including external cladding. As the potential cost of any remedial works, its funding and timing remain unclear, the clause remains in place. Government guidance is also under review, and it is not known how remedial works may impact the value of the flats or require funding from leaseholders. Consequently, the SIV has not changed its valuation from March 2021 but states less certainty and a higher degree of caution should be attached to its valuation of these units, and that it may take longer than the usual 3-6 month marketing period should a decision be made to sell them individually. All residents are aware of the situation and additional fire safety measures have been implemented. The 17 flats held by the fund, of which 12 are in a building below 18m, are part of a larger development of 600 apartments. Due to the fact that a Material Valuation Uncertainty clause has been attached to these properties, the 30th June 2021 financial statements were qualified.

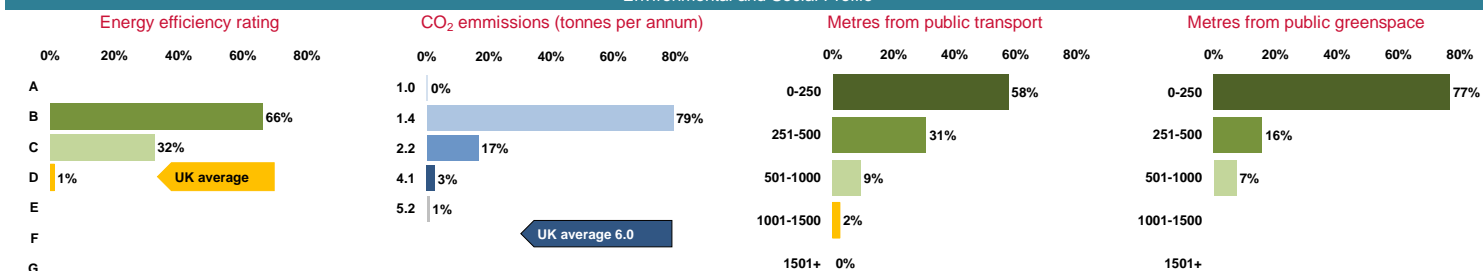
